Dr Bill Hayton is an Associate Fellow with the Asia-Pacific Programme at Chatham House and the Editor of the RSAA's journal Asian Affairs. He is a former BBC journalist who has worked across the world spending time as the BBC correspondent in Vietnam and embedded with the state broadcaster of Myanmar. Hayton is the author of four books covering China, Vietnam and the South China Sea, a second edition of his Vietnam: Rising Dragon was published in 2020.



Elina Noor is a Senior Fellow with the Asia Program at Carnegie where she focuses on developments in Southeast Asia, particularly the impact and implications of technology in reshaping power dynamics, governance, and nation-building in the region. She currently serves on the UN Secretary–General's Advisory Board on Disarmament Matters. Previously, Noor was Director of Political–Security Affairs at the Asia Society Policy Institute.



Dr Prashanth Parameswaran is a Senior Columnist at The Diplomat and the Founder of the weekly ASEAN Wonk newsletter, focused on advancing a global and comprehensive approach to analysing Southeast Asia and Indo-Pacific foreign and security policy. A political scientist by training, Parameswaran's research and analysis focuses on Southeast Asian political and security issues, Asian defence affairs, US foreign policy in the Asia-Pacific and global geopolitics.



Dr Ann Marie Murphy is a Professor in the School of Diplomacy and International Relations at Seton Hall University, where she directs the Center for Foreign Policy Studies. Her research focuses on Southeast Asian international politics and her edited volume, Southeast Asia Views the United States: Perceptions, Policies and Prospects (2025), examines the region's bilateral relationships with the United States from the Southeast Asian perspective.

Dr James Ryan is the Executive Director of the Middle East Research and Information Project and the Ottoman and Turkish Studies Association as well as being an Adjunct Professor of History and International Studies at Rowan University. He is a historian focusing on the history and politics of the Ottoman Empire and Türkiye in the 20th and 21st centuries and is currently working on a book project investigating interwar dissent and opposition in Türkiye.



Dr Burcu Ozcelik is a Senior Research Fellow for Middle East Security within the International Security Department at RUSI. With over 15 years' experience in geopolitical risk analysis, security and threat assessments, and strategic advisory in both the public and private sector, Ozcelik specialises in the Middle East, North Africa, Türkiye and the Eastern Mediterranean. Her work received the inaugural Iris Young & David Held International Prize in Democratic Theory.



Steven A Cook is Eni Enrico Mattei Senior Fellow for Middle East and Africa Studies at the Council on Foreign Relations. He is an expert on Arab and Turkish politics as well as US-Middle East policy. Cook is the author of the recently published book, The End of Ambition: America's Past, Present, and Future in the Middle East (Oxford University Press, 2024). Cook is also a columnist for Foreign Policy magazine.



Dr Lina Khatib is currently an Associate Fellow, having previously been Director, of the Middle East and North Africa Programme at Chatham House and is a visiting scholar with the Harvard Kennedy School's Middle East Initiative at the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs. She was, previously, Director of the SOAS Middle East Institute and Professor of Practice at the Department of Politics and International Studies at SOAS.

Dr Edward Howell is a Lecturer in International Relations at the University of Oxford. His research expertise focuses on the politics and international relations of North Korea, the Korean Peninsula, and East Asia. He specialises in North Korea's domestic and foreign policy, particularly its nuclear programme, and the relations between North Korea, the US, and the wider international community. Howell is also an experienced media analyst and commentator.



Shihoko Goto is a Senior Fellow at the Mansfield Foundation and a member of their US-Japan Network for the Future. She specialises in trade and economic interests across the Indo-Pacific, and is also focused on geopolitical developments in Japan, South Korea and Taiwan. Goto is a columnist for the Diplomat magazine and a contributing editor at the Globalist. She is also a member of the Global Taiwan Institute's US-Taiwan Task Force.



Dr Sung-Yoon Lee is a Principal Fellow at the Sejong Institute and author of The Sister: The Extraordinary Story of Kim Yo Jong, North Korea's Most Powerful Woman (London: MacMillan, 2023). Dr Lee has testified as an expert witness at the US House of Representatives Committee on Foreign Affairs and Subcommittee on Asia Hearings on North Korea policy and has advised senior officials and elected leaders, including the President of the United States.



Yuki Tatsumi is a Senior Fellow, Co-Director of the East Asia Program and Director of the Japan Program at the Stimson Center. Previously, Tatsumi worked as a research associate at CSIS and as a special assistant for political affairs at the Embassy of Japan in Washington. In 2012, she was awarded a Letter of Appreciation from the Japanese Ministry of National Policy for her contribution to advancing mutual understanding between the US and Japan.
